As the largest and heaviest of U.S. coins minted after the Civil War, Morgan dollars have always been prized by investors and collectors alike. Although hundreds of millions of Morgans were minted between 1878 and 1904, the majority of them—some 300 million coins—were melted as a result of the provisions of the Pittman Act of 1918. In 1921, coinage of the Morgans was resumed until the coin was replaced by the new Peace Type Dollar later that year.
